

RATING THE LEGISLATIVE OUTCOMES

The 2013 General Assembly is in the history books ... now it's evaluation time! On the following pages we talk to experts, both inside our organization and at the Statehouse, to get various perspectives on how the legislative session will be remembered. Also included is the important annual assessment of legislators' voting performance.
